The Pharisee and the  
Tax Collector  
Luke 18:9-14

The main idea of this parable is "righteousness."

1. Do you agree or disagree? What subtopics would you say there are?

Temple life is still important to Christians! The concept of temple means God graciously meeting us and maintaining connection with his people. Don't misunderstand though, it's not about the ritual, it's about the relationship—read Hosea 6:5-7 and Matthew 9:12-13.

The Greek for righteousness and justify is the same word: *Dikaiosune* (noun) translated as righteousness, *dikaioo* (verb) translated as justify.

**The Bible is clear we have no righteousness of our own:** And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness and sanctification and redemption—1 Cor 1:30

**Rather Jesus himself is our righteousness.**

2. Is the concept of righteousness getting clearer? What does it mean to say "Jesus is our righteousness"? Try putting that in your own words.

3. If what you do doesn't have any bearing on whether you are "righteous," why does it matter what you do at all?

(For this question, try reading through **Romans 6** a few verses at a time, stopping to put Paul's words into your own, and talking about it with someone as you go.)



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
